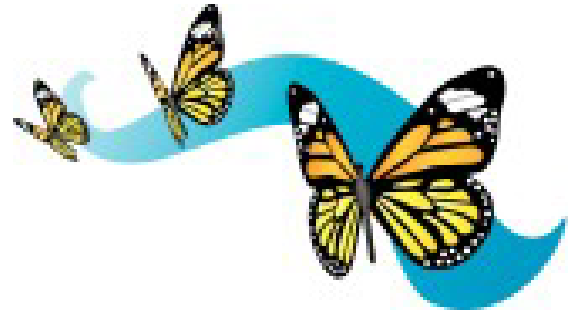


Monarchs 101 summer class
